

The Macy Catheter

A new option for patient comfort

When medications cannot be taken by mouth or are no longer effective, the Macy Catheter allows medications to be given quickly and comfortably.

In hospice care, patients often need medication to control symptoms such as pain, agitation, and difficulty breathing. Patients sometimes can't take the medication by mouth, but the Macy Catheter offers a comfortable and private way to give medication. The catheter is a small, soft tube that allows medication to be easily delivered in the rectum. It can remain in place for up to 28 days.

The Macy Catheter helps control symptoms quickly and allows patients to remain in the setting of their choice. Medications can be given without disturbing or repositioning the patient.



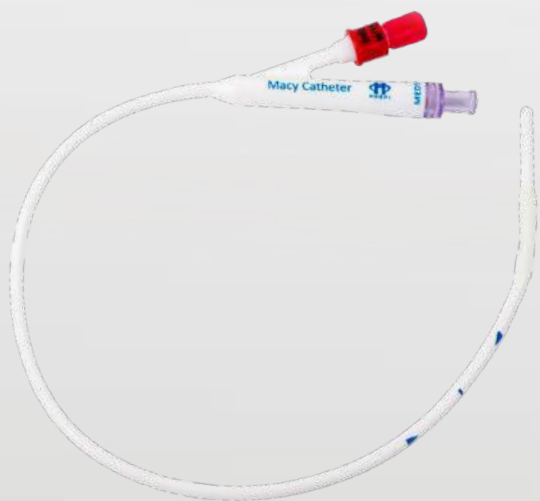
When the Macy Catheter is needed...

Call your hospice agency if you are concerned about a patient's ability to swallow medications or if symptoms are not well-controlled.

A Macy Catheter can be placed by a trained nurse via a simple and painless three-minute procedure. Once in place, medications that can control symptoms can be administered easily.

The Macy Catheter is comfortable. It is designed to come out easily when the patient has a bowel movement. If this occurs, the catheter may be reinserted.*
